

DRAFT AGREEMENT FOR ACADEMIC CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE  
UNIVERSITY OF DUBLIN AND THE ARISTOTLE UNIVERSITY OF  
THESSALONIKI

Article 1

The purpose of the agreement is to establish and strengthen scholarly co-operation between the University of Dublin and the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki.

Article 2

The overall responsibility for the organisation of the academic exchange will belong to the School of Classics at the University of Dublin, in consultation with the Dean of Overseas and Visiting Student, and the Department of Classical Philology and Ancient History and the School of English at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. It is expected that other departments within each University will wish to participate, once the Agreement comes into force.

Article 3

The cooperation and mutual assistance will take the following forms:

1. Each university will provide gratis such information as is requested on courses and scholarly activities of faculty.
2. The two Universities will grant each other full use of their respective libraries, subject to the normal restrictions in force for academic visitors.
3. Members of the academic staff of each University will be eligible for nomination as co-examiners, as required, on the Examining Boards of the other University and/or submit their views in writing.
4. The two Universities will facilitate the exchange of academic staff in the above fields for an academic year or part thereof for lectures, teaching and/or research.
5. The Aristotle University of Thessaloniki will offer each year up to two scholarships for a year to postgraduate students of the University of Dublin. In return such students will each year give up to four hours per week teaching assistance in English language in the School of

English during the period of the academic year.

6. The Aristotle University of Thessaloniki will offer each year up to two Scholarships for the Summer Courses of Modern Greek language to undergraduate and graduate students and members of the academic staff of the University of Dublin.

7. The University of Dublin undertakes to accept each year up to two postgraduate students of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki into M.A. schemes of study in any field of study for which the agreement of the department concerned is forthcoming, offering one tuition fee waiver and one free place in university accommodation. (These may be combined for one student, or offered separately to two.) Such postgraduate students will be required to give up to two hours teaching assistance in Modern Greek language per week during the first and second terms of the academic year in the School of Classics.

8. Every assistance will be given by each University in the above fields to postgraduate students of the other University who wish to make brief visits of up to one academic year in the course of their research.

#### Article 4

Each University will explore the possibility of developing bilateral ERASMUS-type programmes, to facilitate the exchange of staff and students.

#### Article 5

At the end of each year a report, including financial details, will be submitted to the authorities of each University for approval.

#### Article 6

This agreement will serve in the first instance for a period of three years and will be subject to renewal every three years. Any alteration

of the agreement should be with the consent of both parties. It may be terminated by either party with six months' notice.
