



STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT between UNIVERSIDAD INTERNACIONAL, MEXICO and ARISTOTLE UNIVERSITY OF THESSALONIKI, GREECE

In the interests of expanding educational opportunities, Universidad Internacional and Aristotle University of Thessaloniki express their will to establish an exchange program for undergraduate and graduate students under the existing International Cooperation Agreement between both institutions, and

AGREE TO

- Article 1. Objective. The objective of this agreement is to develop a reciprocal international exchange program that promotes student international mobility.
- Article 2. Exchange Coordinator. Each institution will appoint an officer responsible for the coordination and administration of the exchange, including the selection and counseling of the exchange participants. At Universidad Internacional, professor Stéphane Thys, Director of the Internationalization DepInternational Affairs, will serve as Exchange Coordinator, and at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, that role will be fulfilled by Ms. Helen Bahtsavanopoulou - Kotsaki, Head of the Department of International Relations.
- Article 3. Duration of Exchanges. Each institution agrees to exchange individual students for a semester or an academic year, ideally on a one-for-one-basis.
- Article 4. Number of Students to be Exchanged. The number of qualified students in the exchange program will be 5 students per semester for both institutions.
- Article 5. Balancing the Exchange. Equality in numbers of exchange students is the objective of the agreement. However, each institution should be prepared to consider a disparity in any given semester or year during the agreed period. All imbalances shall be resolved by the end of the period of agreement.
- Article 6. Student Eligibility. The exchange coordinator at each institution, acting upon consultation with the appropriate academic unit, will be responsible for the selection of suitable nominees for exchange. It is understood that the coordinator will nominate students who are both academically and personally suitable for exchange abroad and that details of academic background as well as references will be provided to the host institution. It is hoped that the host institution will not reject a nominated student unless he/she does not meet established admission requirements for international students, or unless the host institution cannot guarantee availability of required courses.
- Article 7. Exchange Conditions. Students will be responsible for payment of tuition and related fees to their home institution, as well as full costs of travel to and from the host institution, travel documents and visas, all living, subsistence and accommodation expenses in the host country, and housing and meal arrangements and costs during vacation periods.
- Article 8. Exchange Procedure. At the beginning of each semester the exchange coordinators of both institutions will inform the candidates of the exchange program. The host institution will send a letter of admission to each candidate specifying the exchange dates and conditions.

The host institution will issue a certificate at the end of the exchange period, stating the courses, grades and credits taken by the exchange student.





Article 9. Duration and Completion. This agreement shall be in effect for a period of 5 years from the date of its signing, and may be extended by mutual consent of both institutions for a period beyond its original date of expiration. Either institution may terminate this agreement by sending written notice to the other institution; such termination will take effect six months from the date of that written notice.
