



# **RESIDENCY IN EQUINE REPRODUCTION**

The Clinical Equine Department of the Veterinary Campus of the University of Lyon organizes a 3-year residency program in equine reproduction for the academic **years of 2022 through 2024**. The training program will allow the candidate to acquire in-depth knowledge in all aspects of equine reproduction and assisted reproductive techniques (ART) following the guidelines of ECAR / ACT (European College of Animal reproduction/ American College of Theriogenologists).

# **Prerequisites**

The candidate must be a qualified veterinary surgeon and have graduated from an institution accredited by the ECAR or ACT. He/she must hold a license to practice veterinary medicine in a European country. The candidate must have completed at least one year of additional clinical training in an academic environment (rotating internship), or, failing this, at least 24 months in a veterinary clinic meeting the criteria dictated by the ECAR or ACT. A satisfactory knowledge of the French language is highly recommended.

## Process and description of activities

- The program duration will be 3 years (156 weeks). Each resident is supervised by a Program Supervisor and a Resident Advisor. The residency program specifications will take into account the curriculum vitae of the candidate, the guidelines of the ECAR/ACT (Residency Program Guidelines) and the operating procedures of the equine clinic of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital (CHUV) of the University of Lyon. At least 60% of the program (94 weeks) must be spent in reproduction under the supervision of an ECAR or ACT Diplomate. The resident can also follow courses during a certain amount of weeks in a small animal, bovine or porcine reproduction center supervised by an ECAR or ACT Diplomate in order to prepare for the exam.
- The resident must participate in the out-of-hours emergency duty rota during the breeding season. He/she
  will also participate regularly in the outpatient activity. A period equivalent to 27 weeks will be available to
  develop and implement a clinical research project and to write 2 publications aimed at journals approved
  by the ECAR publication list.
- The resident must participate in journal rounds, and in the practical and clinical teaching of students. Over the 3-year period of the program, the resident must prepare at least 5 scientific presentations, including at least 3 at the Residents' Forum of the Veterinary Faculty and 2 at the annual ECAR, ISER, SFT, ISSR and ESDAR meetings.
- At the end of the program the resident will be able to submit his or her application file to the ECAR/ACT in order to receive permission to sit the board certifying exam.

# The Program starts on the 1<sup>st</sup> of February 2022

#### **Salary** (net monthly minimum):

1st year: 1204 €; 2<sup>nd</sup> year: 1264 €; 3<sup>rd</sup> year: 1324€.
