#### 5. Admission

After the payment is verified, the letter of acceptance will be sent to the home university.

#### 6. Visa Application

Visit the student's home country's Korean Consulate homepage to find information regarding how to apply for the proper student visa. The expected timeline for a visa to be issued will depend on each individual country. On the Korean Consulate's homepage, the expected time frame of visa issuance will be listed. Please be sure to prepare the required documents and apply for the visa early to insure the student can begin classes on time. If you do not apply for a visa within a month after the admission certificate issuance date, your application for a visa will not be accepted by the embassy. If you enter to Korea without a study visa, you have to return to your home country and apply for a visa.

## **7. Tuberculosis Examination Results**

Conduct a Tuberculosis Examination for your visa issuance and for your dormitory. [Send the Tuberculosis Examination results in PDF form through e-mail \(international@mail.ulsan.ac.kr\)](mailto:international@mail.ulsan.ac.kr). Depending on the country there may or may not be a designated hospital to have a tuberculosis examination conducted, please confirm this with your country's Korean Consulate. If there is no designated hospital, any hospital can conduct the examination. Unless you submit the tuberculosis examination result, you are not allowed to move in the dormitory.

## **8. Entry Schedule Information**

After purchasing plane tickets, please email a copy of your flight information to the University of Ulsan. Orientation will be held 2 or 3 days prior to the beginning of the semester, and students are able to move into the dormitory around a week before the semester begins. The orientation may be held online depending on the COVID-19 situation.

## **9. Arrival at the University of Ulsan**

You are responsible for finding your route from the airport to the University, there will be no pickup bus or shuttle that takes you directly from the airport to the University of Ulsan. The site below will help with directions to reach the university.

1. Exchange students may take the Intensive Korean Language class for no additional charge.
2. Below are the two options exchange students have regarding their class choices
  - Mon ~ Fri 4 hours a day of Intensive Korean Language class + Bachelor's classes
  - \* Please note that the Korean language courses are not regular course provided by the university. Therefore, they will not be reflected on the transcripts.
  - Bachelor's Classes
  - \* Students can take up to 18 credits per semester at the university.
3. In the case of exchange students staying for one year, you can take the Intensive Korean Language course for the 1<sup>st</sup> semester and take undergraduate courses for the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
4. In order to meet the graduation credit requirements, many students don't take the Intensive Korean Language class, they just take the undergraduate courses.
