Health Insurance & Immunizations

All exchange visitors (J-1) and their dependents (J-2) are required by the U.S. Department of State to have medical insurance coverage for their duration of stay with the following minimum benefits:

- Medical benefits of at least \$100,000 per accident or illness
- Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000
- Expenses associated with the medical evacuation of the exchange visitor to his or her home country in the amount of \$50,000
- A deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness.
- A policy must be underwritten by an insurance carrier with:
 -an AM Best rating of "A-" or above
- -an Insurance Solvency International, Ltd (ISI) rating of "A-I" or above -a Standard and Poor's Claims Paying Ability rating of "A-" or above
- -or a Weiss Research, Inc. rating of "B+" or above

Required & Recommended Immunizations:

- Meningitis (Required if living in on-campus housing)
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (Recommended)
- Hepatitis B (Recommended)
